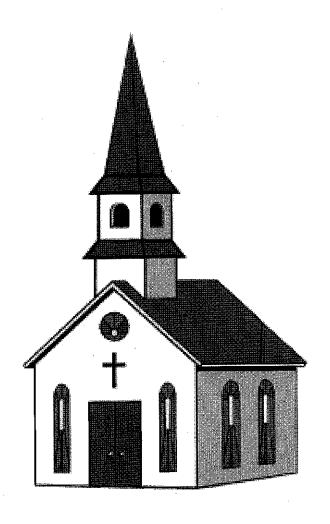

What a difference a year can make! In March of 2019, I was installed as the pastor for Hope Lutheran. The first ten months of my call have been busy learning the ropes. Every congregation has different traditions and stories. It's been interesting to find out yours.

In the 10 months I have served at your pastor, I have officiated at 3 baptisms. Nine young members took first communion classes and took part of their first Communion. We had 1 wedding at Hope this summer. We confirmed 12 young people this fall. I officiated at 7 funerals this year. Only two of the funerals were held in our congregation. The rest of the funerals took place in the funeral homes.

We were excited to welcome in 12 new members this year. We had only two transfer out to new congregations.

I have been excited to take part of the WELCA quilting and be a part of their meetings and Bible Study as often as I can.

This year we have tried some new things. This summer we hosted "walking devotions" which emphasized taking care of our bodies and our community while talking about the Word of God. This fall, we started having "Family Fun Nights". These nights offer fellowship and fun for members and community people of all ages. We began a Bible study on the book of James held 2 Wednesdays and month. We will continue to look for new ways to reach into our community and our families with God's love.

What do all these numbers and programs mean? To me, they are signs of a congregation that is alive and working to be representatives of Christ in our community. I love the way you step up when you are needed in the community.

2019 has been a tough year for our farmers and our community. This shows in a congregation too. A hard and prolonged harvest meant many people did not make it to church. For some of our neighbors, no harvest meant no real paycheck for the year. This also has shown in our church offerings. Times like these were planned for in the past when they put away CDs in the bank for a time of great need. This year, we gratefully cashed in one of our CDs to help with expenses. God continues to walk with us and provide even in hours that seem dark.

We are so grateful for all of you and the efforts you make for Hope Lutheran Church. We are so grateful for those who came before and in times of plenty saved up for our times of need. We are so grateful for our God who is ALWAYS faithful.

We look forward to a new beginning at the dawn of a new decade in 2020. We, the people of Hope, will stand faithful to our God as a place of peace and love in our community.

2019 Council Report

2019 was a year of change for Hope Lutheran Church. We were blessed to have Pastor Janet Miller accept our call. She was installed by Bishop Zellmer on March 31, 2019.

We continue to maintain our beautiful church, working out heat and water kinks. We did spend most of last winter and spring with a hose from the neighbors as our main water supply due to freezing of pipes in the street. Everything thawed in the spring and worked out, but if you see the water on a slow stream in the kitchen, leave it on. We recently had Berkner's here to fix the furnace, it did not want to start but that problem has also been resolved. We were able to add air conditioning to our sanctuary for those hot summer mornings, we didn't need it much last fall, but are looking forward to using it if needed next summer. One project we have on the books is sidewalk repair. We are waiting for the city to decide what they are going to do with the streets for drainage before we tackle this job. Lastly, our beautiful church is in need of paint on the main part of the church. We will hopefully tackle this in warmer months. We did explore siding, but this is a very expensive undertaking, we were hoping to have some numbers for discussion, but it was very difficult to get a contractor to come and give us quotes this summer.

Dovetailing off the previous paragraph, weather has definitely been a factor affecting church services this past year. We missed 6 Sunday's and 2 Lenten Services this past year due to weather conditions, no travel advised, etc. With Church cancelations, we did fall short of our budget goals and the council did vote to cash in one of our CD's to pay the end of the year bills, you will see this on our financial report.

Lastly, we were able to celebrate 50 years since merging Lebanon, Zion, and Summit Church Parish's to create Hope Lutheran Church. We were blessed to have past ministers come and join in our celebration at a pie social on Saturday night and church service and luncheon on Sunday. It was great to see Rev. Gary Olson, Rev. Joyce Capp, and Rev. Justin Neugebauer come and celebrate with us, participating in the service and sharing their gifts. We have truly been blessed as a congregation.

We continue to pray for God's Blessings as we embark on the next 50 years. Thank you all for sharing your time, talents, and gifts. It has been a pleasure to represent and serve this congregation.

We meet twice a month, usually the first and third Thursday of each month. On the first Thursday we meet at 9;00a.m. for quilting and after lunch we have our business meeting and Bible Study. The second Thursday we meet just for quilting at 9:00a.m. and are usually done at noon. This year, there was no meeting or quilting in February and our annual Soup/Sandwich/Pie & Bake Sale was again held in May because of the snowy weather!! The money earned from our Soup/Sandwich/Pie & Bake Sale is used to help further the education of the women & youth of Hope Lutheran and to fund our Causes of the Month.

In August we take a Field Trip, which we plan at our July meeting. This year we quilted in the morning and had lunch at Pastor Janet's lake cabin. In December we were again invited to Pastor Janet's home for our Christmas Luncheon, followed by singing Christmas Carols and a Christmas Reading and collecting gifts for the Beacon Center in Watertown.

If you have the time, come and join us for the fun and fellowship we have while making quilts. There are between 4-6 of us and this year we were able to send 145 quilts to Lutheran World Relief. Also, with everyone's help we sent 121 school kits, 36 personal care kits and 45 pounds of soap!! A special offering was also taken to help with the cost of shipping the quilts and kits. Again, it truly shows what people working together can accomplish!!

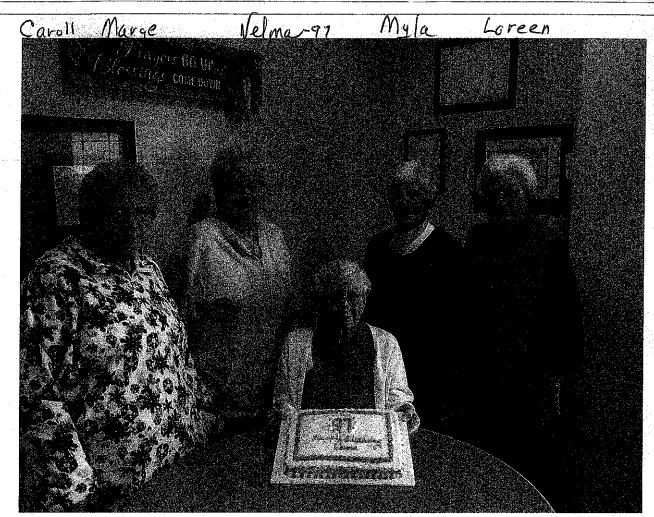
Bibles were given to the third graders and quilts to our graduating seniors. The HLCW gave financial gifts: Ephpatha, Native American Ministries, Global Missions, Campus Ministry, Lutheran Social Services, Lutherans Outdoors, St. Dysmas, Lamp, World Hunger, Beacon Center, E. Disaster Fund, Go-Fund-Me (Nathalie), Conf./Synod Offerings, and Thankofferings.

The HLCW regularly send one-third of their general meeting offerings to the Church wide Synodical Ministries. Individuals also support the Runner Club with quarterly offerings. This is our Prairie Coteau Conference project and helps provide support for a missionary couple.

Remember, all the ladies of Hope Lutheran belong to the General Serving Group that provides food and workers for funerals, pot lucks, soup & sandwich day or any other special occasions that may occur. All general committees, serving groups and monthly W/ELCA meetings are printed in the yearly program booklets available to each lady of Hope Lutheran. The supplies needed for the school kits. Personal care kits and fabric kits are listed in the booklet. Be sure to pick yours up, keep it handy!!

We are always looking for more members to keep us going!! Come have some fun and do some good things together! Our monthly Bible Studies are sometimes in our "Gather" magazine. Right now, we are studying the Book of James and the studies are led by Pastor Janet.

Looking at the life of the synod in 2019, I would like to thank Bishop Emeritus David Zellmer and his associates, Bishop Bill Tesch and Deacon Susan Marone once again for their fine leadership the past twelve years. 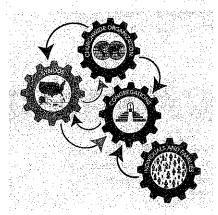

WHERE DOES MY OFFERING GO?



ELCA members in more than 9,300 congregations in the United States and Caribbean give approximately \$1.75 billion in regular offering to support ELCA ministries in their local communities and worldwide. When members give through their congregations, a percentage of that money is then shared with the local synod and the national churchwide organization.

This unrestricted giving, called Mission Support, gives us both the foundation and the fuel to do God's work in the world and a portion of the gifts circle back to support ministries in synods and local congregations. Of these unrestricted gifts, the churchwide organization receives around 2.6 percent. This represents the largest portion of the ELCA churchwide organization's operating budget.
