Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There is a lot of activity this summer on our small country road. Giant machines are bringing by huge parts. Tons of cement went by in mixer trucks. Yesterday, blades went by. Our church and community have experienced a similar change this year. This decision was based on CDC recommendations, the number of cases among our members and our ability to hold worship outside for now. The vote for this decision was unanimous. We are making our decisions month by month. We hope to have better news on the virus soon but until we do, this is our new normal.

I pray that our God heals our hurting land and soon brings us together again. Until then, I offer you the blessing and instructions I use to end worship each week:

Sunday School online

We will be loading content for Sunday School on both YouTube channel and Facebook for the first few months. We will take the first couple weeks in September to get it all set up and from there parents will be notified where to look for lessons.

Confirmation

The South Dakota Synod has been working hard to get a Confirmation curriculum online for free. Pastor Janet has taken one class on it and will take her second soon. Following the classes, pastor will work on uploading the lessons we want for our kids and we can hopefully start learning by the end of September. If the Covid 19 problem is solved, we can also use these materials for in person teaching.

Fall Theological

The South Dakota Synod is following CDC guidelines and not meeting in big groups. Therefore, their fall theological for pastors will be held online. Pastor Janet will take this class by Zoom on September 21st.

Online services will continue on Facebook and will also soon be put on our new YouTube channel called Hope's Children. Our new YouTube channel will be running within the next couple weeks. Car Worship will be held Sunday mornings at 10:30 am through the month of September.

Easier said than done these days when all things education seem to be everything they weren't last year at this time.
