My heart hurts for the pastor who will have to help lay the child to rest. Most of all, my heart hurts for the child who could see no other way out.

I hate to talk about grief for two newsletters in a row. But, this is the reality for the communities of Waubay, Summit, Wilmot and Milbank who are all dealing with the after affects of sudden and untimely loss.

The traditional words of Ash Wednesday are ringing in my ears, "remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." The Lenten season ahead feels heavy.

But, as I think about the season, I have decided Lent is exactly what we all need right now. We need the time to sit and contemplate with our God and our congregation. Together, we remind each other that we are mortal and our God is not. Together we will hear of the Word come down, his love and his sacrifice for us mortal people. Together, we can bring our burdens to the ONLY one who can hold them.

We can do all this together and be reassured that Easter is coming! As we remember again the lies that death tells us, we are reminded of the absolute truth. While the cross and the grave may have seemed like the ultimate power, they were nothing to the power of our God!

While the world and our frail bodies fail. Our God does not. While we worry and mourn about those not with us. Our God heals, calls and welcomes them home. Easter is coming! Easter is the ultimate truth. The powers of sin and death could not hold our God. Jesus defeated the powers of sin and death and ROSE!

January 28, 2024 - Annual Meeting

Welcome and opening by President Traci Ellingson. Traci appointed Annelies S acting secretary.

M-Tim G, 2nd-Dustin H to proceed without a quorum (30 confirmed members present). Passed.

M-Tamijo B, 2nd-Heather C to accept the 2022 (1/29/2023) Annual Meeting Minutes. Passed.

Financial Reports: Audit Committee did not have chance to meet. All financial reports were presented as "unaudited." The committee will give its report to the Church Council, and it will be included in the Annual Meeting next year.

Tim G gave Cemetery update: The Cemetery Fund reimbursed the General Fund for 2023 mowing. There was income from the sale of several plots, maintenance fees, and a donation. There are plans to seek additional land from the Larson Family and to update the fence. A Cemetery Board will be formed with at least 3 people. Tim G & Traci E volunteered to start the board.

Annelies S reported on several funds. Noisy Offering taken during Children's Church is the main source of income for the Sunday School Fund The SS Fund buys supplies & materials for both Sunday School and VBS. The Campership fund gave support to 5 youth to attend camp in 2023 and 1 "counsellorship" for a member that worked at NeSoDak Bible Camp. Lent suppers, Easter breakfast, & donations provided the funds. The High School Youth Group Fund sold Christmas Greens in 2023. The fund paid the deposit for 11 youth and 1 adult to attend the 2024 ELCA National Youth Gathering to be held in New Orleans in July. They will travel with a group from northeast SD. They will hold several fundraisers in the next 5 months.

The General Fund ended the year with positive income due to fundraising for the Siding Project that is still in progress. Without the building project fundraising, the General Fund was -\$10,897 for 2023.

M-Dustin H, 2nd-Michelle U to accept all the (unaudited) financial reports. Passed.

M-Diane K, 2nd-Beth H to accept Pastor Janet's report. In addition to her written report, she stated that she will be leading a service at Cedar View in Watertown monthly. Passed. Laura F stressed the importance of informing Pastor Janet or a member of the Church Council of people in need of visits or prayers. Visitations are important for members who cannot attend worship in person. Also, Hospice needs volunteers,

Traci S highlighted the past year: baptisms, boilers serviced, new glass partition door between sanctuary & fellowship hall. Thank you was expressed to Annelies S (treasurer), offering team: Beth H, Earline H, Bruce K; Becky P (SS Lead), Laurie K (kitchen/funerals), John S (boiler repairs), Val M (organist) for their service.

The quilters shipped 111 quilts & 100 school kits to Lutheran World Relief in October. They meet the 1st & 3rd Thursday each month at 9:00 am. Everyone is welcome to join them.

M-Tamijo B, 2nd-Sarah H to accept all the "other" reports as presented in the Annual Report.


